

Highlight 1: 13 Interns



- Interns have come from all regions of Idaho, not just the Boise area.
- They worked in both Spanish and English and across all mediums: TV, radio and print.
- Coverage includes arts, crime, environment, state politics, diversity issues, Latino affairs, community development and the Moscow Murders.
- Of those 13, 7 were selected this year.
- Voces has more than doubled the number of Latinos in Idaho's newsrooms.
- Our interns and alumni have created or contributed to nearly all current bilingual news efforts in Idaho.
- Our efforts help newsrooms secure diverse and local talent.
- So far, eight interns received job offers after their internships


Highlight 3: +100 Donors

Almost all of our funding comes from **grants, community fundraising events and individual donors**. Thanks to recurring partnerships with the Scripps Howard Fund and The Ñ Fund for Latinas in Journalism, grants now make up the bulk of our general funding.

But we've also developed newsroom partnerships. Several newsrooms, including KTVB Channel 7, 103.5 KISS F.M., Idaho Public Television and States Newsroom affiliate The Idaho Capital Sun have partially or fully covered a Voces intern salary, while Voces provided the mentorship and support.
